In the house he is clean and not destructive, apart from dog toys. A child free house would be best for him. He is very ball motivated and travels well in a car. We do not know what he is like with cats, but he did previously live with another dog. He is KC registered and up to date with his vaccinations. He is currently fed on Natural Instincts raw food topped up with Dr Johns Gold. Storm is highly energetic and will require a lot of exercise. Once he gets to know you he is very loving and slowly he is learning to relax and not always be on the go. An ideal owner for him is someone who is confident and experienced with working breeds and who understands it takes time and dedication. The new owners will be offered free initial training and support through the club during his settling in period. Jazz up your doggy training treats with these easy recipes. Both recipes can be frozen.

Doggy Cheese Biscuits

Ingredients:

- 125g all purpose flour
- 25g grated parmesan cheese
- 25g grated cheddar cheese
- 1 egg
- 350ml evaporated milk

Preheat the oven to 175°C. Mix together all ingredients until well blended. Scoop out teaspoon size blobs and roll into balls with your hands. Place the dough balls on a greased baking tray and bake for 10-12 minutes

TUNA LOAF

Ingredients:

- 2 tins of tuna in oil
- 2 eggs
- 160g of flour (wholemeal or plain)
- 1 garlic clove

Mix everything together to form a thick paste-like consistency. Spread out on large plate and microwave on high for 4mins, turn over and cook for another minute

Remember variety is the spice of life so why not freeze your left over roast dinner as well and bring a mixed platter of high value reward treats to make training easier.

TRAINING TIP

I regularly have owners asking for help because their dog constantly pulls on the leash which is attached to a harness. My standard answer is, "the harness was designed to encourage and allow an animal to pull, so why are you surprised the dog pulls?" The harness was not designed for compliance, but to enable the weight being pulled to be distributed in a more even and efficient way. Think of the harness used by horses to pull a carriage or those worn by Huskies with a sled.

Teach your dog to understand the heel position and to walk nicely on a loose leash, and then if you wish, your dog can wear a harness or any other device.
